Arid Adaptations

Forces

- Forces can be exerted by one object on another through direct contact or from a distance. (PHYSICAL Year 4 ACSSU076)
– PC: Magnetic Moves / Smooth Moves and/or QCAA: The Force of Friction
- Change to an object's motion is caused by unbalanced forces, including Earth's gravitational attraction, acting on the object. (PHYSICAL Year 7 ACSSU117)
