Teacher Notes and Parent Support Material



Learning Activities

Pages	Teaching	Learning
Cover and title page	Text prediction from title	Children discuss the colours and hat style and gender of child on cover. Children discuss their own hat collections and their favourite colours and hats Children recall the important reasons we wear hats and extend their knowledge with other reasons why people wear hats.
Hat Parade! Hat Parade! Which hat will you wear today? A fancy hat in peacock blue How I wish I had one too!	 Discuss hat style Discuss Peacock Blue Discuss other shades of blue Discuss "fancy" hats Children draw their own "fancy blue hat". 	From one designer, children redesign hat, perhaps making it for a project task to wear to the class hat parade. Oral assessment: Recount how child made their hat including: Design, colours chosen, materials needed, who helped them, how they made it and what they think of the finished product.
Discuss Colour words	Make a list of the colour words. Make a list of new words for the colours around the classroom. E.g.: Cloud white smart board	Comprehension and information gathering. Extending ideas
Various pages	Creative writing:	Children decide which their favourite toy is in the story and write down their toy of choice. Next, children write a story of this favourite identified toy and where/who it came from. Finally, children illustrate and label the parts of their toys (e.g.: Plane: wings, body, tail, engine etc.)



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All pages	Fabrics and Textile Art	Children experience from assorted fabrics described in book what these textures feel like. Teacher gathers sample fabrics/ off cuts (ask for parent helpers to donate samples from letter Appendix A). Children discuss how each texture feels and a class list is made of the describing words Eg: Silk feels smooth Feathers feel soft Wool feels warm
All pages	Culture project task	Discuss hats others around the world may wear. Children find a hat worn in another nation and learn three facts about this hat. Students present their facts to the class.
All pages	Graphs and Statistics -Chance and Data Mathematics	Children vote on their favourite hat in the book. They draw the hat and explain in one sentence why they like the hat they chose. Class counts the votes for each hat and discovers which hat is the winner of the hat parade contest.
All pages	Music	Children learn the text as a song and perform this for a special event or for singing enjoyment. The music can be downloaded from the Queensland Museum website following the learning links.
